

Head west from Austin on FM 2244 (Bee Cave Road), take RR 12 south to State Highway 290, then west to Fredericksburg for lunch. Backtrack east on 290, and drop south on FM 1376 to Luckenbach, onto RR 1888 to Blanco, RR 165/FM 2325 to Wimberly and finally north on RR 12 to Dripping Springs and back on 290 into south Austin.
