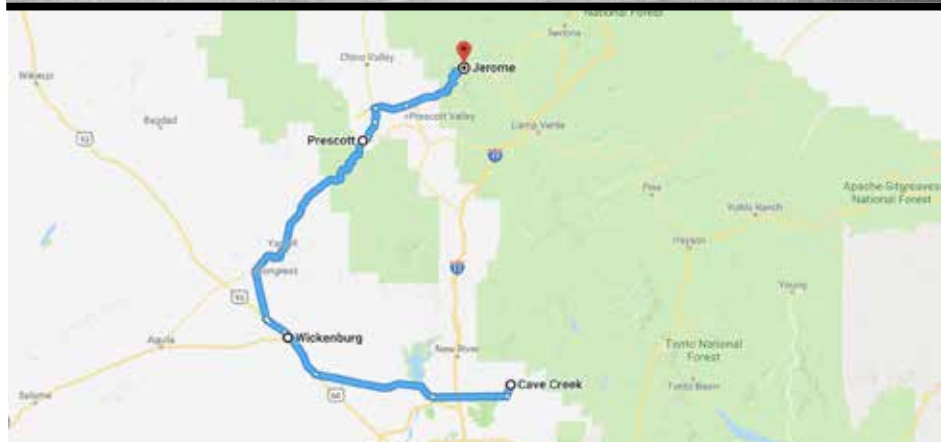

### Local rides

Leaving Cave Creek you'll hop on the Carefree Highway to AZ-74 East to US-60 East through Wickenburg, the Dude Ranch Capital of Arizona. Pick up US-93 which turns into US-89. The Yarnell twisties will demand your attention as you work your way up to the cool pines and even more demanding turns before rolling into the historic western town of Prescott to visit the famous Whiskey Row. Follow US-89 on to tighter twisties to the mountainside ghost town of Jerome. On the way back, a trip through the scenic Skull Valley adds another 50 miles or an hour and a half to the already 150-mile ride.
