#### Local rides

The Columbia River Highway is one of the 25 elite All-American Roads as designated by the U.S. Department of Transportation. Heading north out of Portland on Interstate 5 towards Vancouver, as soon as you cross the Columbia River (the state line) take a right on WA-14 east following the Columbia River Gorge. Cross the Columbia at the Hood River Bridge and pick up OR-35 South to Mt. Hood (the tallest mountain in Oregon). At Mt. Hood, be sure to make a stop at the Timberline Lodge, a massive mountain lodge that served as the Overlook Hotel for exterior shots in the movie The Shining. Leaving Mt. Hood, get back on OR-35 South, taking a right on US-26 west back into Portland.
